
## New Bishop Appointed for the Diocese of Prince Albert



His Holiness Pope Francis accepted the resignation of the Most Reverend Albert Thévenot, M. Afr., as the Bishop of the Diocese of Prince Albert, and today appointed his successor, Father Stephen Hero. At the time of his appointment, Father Hero was the Rector of St. Joseph Seminary in Edmonton. Bishop Thévenot has been the Bishop of Prince Albert for the past 13 years. He submitted his resignation to the Holy Father upon reaching the age limit of 75, as stipulated by Canon 401 of the *Code of Canon Law*.

Bishop-elect Hero was born on 19 December 1969, in Lachine, Québec. He earned a Bachelor of Arts (Philosophy) from the

Seminary of Christ the King in Mission, British Columbia (1994) and went on to study at the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas (*Angelicum*) in Rome earning a Bachelor in Sacred Theology (1998) as well as a Licence in Sacred Theology (2000). He was ordained to the priesthood on 29 June 2000 for the Archdiocese of Edmonton, where he served as an assistant pastor in parishes and as Vocation Director for the Archdiocese. He returned to Rome to further his studies and obtained a Licence in Liturgical Theology from the Pontifical Liturgical Institute at Sant' Anselmo (2005). Upon returning to Edmonton in 2005, he served as a member of the formation team at St. Joseph Seminary and was likewise a continuing lecturer at Newman Theological College in the areas of Spirituality, Liturgy, and Sacraments. In 2010, he was appointed as Vice Rector of St. Joseph Seminary and was later appointed Rector in 2012.



Bishop Thévenot is originally from Somerset, Manitoba and entered the Missionaries of Africa as a Brother in 1964. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1980 and began his pastoral ministry serving in various parishes and missions in Africa. He spent several years promoting the missions in Western Canada prior to returning to Africa where he served as pastor and in administrative roles on behalf of the Missionaries of Africa. Prior to his episcopal appointment in 2008, he served as the National Secretary for the French Sector of the Pontifical Society for the Propagation of the Faith (Missio-Canada) and was later elected Provincial Superior for North America of the Society of Missionaries of Africa.

As a member of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), Bishop Thévenot served as a member of the Anglican/Roman Catholic Bishops' Dialogue (2009-2021) and the English Sector Commission for Evangelization and Catechesis (2011-2017).

The <u>Diocese of Prince Albert</u> has 82 parishes and missions, with a Catholic population of 39,238 served by 35 diocesan priests, together with four priests and 40 Sisters who are members of institutes of consecrated life, as well as 13 permanent deacons.
