The prophets were the truth-sayers of their day. They were willing to say difficult things—at times to kings, sometimes to religious leaders, and still at other times to the entire community when the community was unfaithful to the Lord God. In our own time, we continue to need those who speak the truth to us. While it is not always pleasant, it is a grace to have people in our lives who smooth out our rough edges. Spouses can be that for one another. Parents are that for their children, as they teach, correct, and discipline in ways that nurture the young ones into adulthood. Presidents need someone willing to say difficult things to them, as do pastors of parishes and anyone in a position of responsibility.

Sometimes social movements rise up and call our attention to injustices that need to be addressed.

Those voices can be prophet-like in our own time. The Church is such a voice when it advocates for the protection of the unborn, the immigrant, and those oppressed. The civil rights movement is such a voice in the face of violence and injustice to people of color. There are voices who call the Catholic Church to be accountable for abuse. Scientists call on us to pay attention to the environment. Whenever and wherever truth-sayers call human beings to become their better selves, there lies the Spirit of God raising a prophetic voice. ●

Prayer for Priests

LORD, life up your holy priests, deacons and religious. Grant them the graces they need to minister to your people. Keep them pure and strong in your love. Give them courage when things are difficult, and accompany them when they are lonely. Strengthen them in times of weakness. AMEN

Dear Padre,

My Protestant friends asked me why we call priests “Father” when Jesus said not to. I don’t know how to answer.

Jesus instructs his disciples, “As for you, do not be called ‘Rabbi.’ You have but one teacher, and you are all brothers. Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven” (Matthew 23:8–9). Taken in context, Jesus is denouncing the scribes and Pharisees for bestowing honors and titles on themselves. If taken literally, this passage would also prohibit us from calling our biological fathers by that name, or our instructors “professor.”

Jesus assures us that God is Father of us all. The early Christian community adopted family terms—father, mother, brother, sister—to show their affiliation through baptism and their mutual faith in the Lord (See Luke 8:21, “My mother and my brothers are those who hear the word of God and act on it.”)

Thus, St. Paul refers to Timothy as his “child in faith” (1 Timothy 1:2; Philippians 2:22). He also tells his Christian converts, “I am writing...to admonish you as my beloved children. Even if you should have countless guides to Christ, yet you do not have many fathers, for I became your father in Christ Jesus through the gospel” (1 Corinthians 4:14–15). Like St. Paul, who speaks of himself as a father in nurturing the faith, priests are called “Father” for their pastoral role in the Church. ●

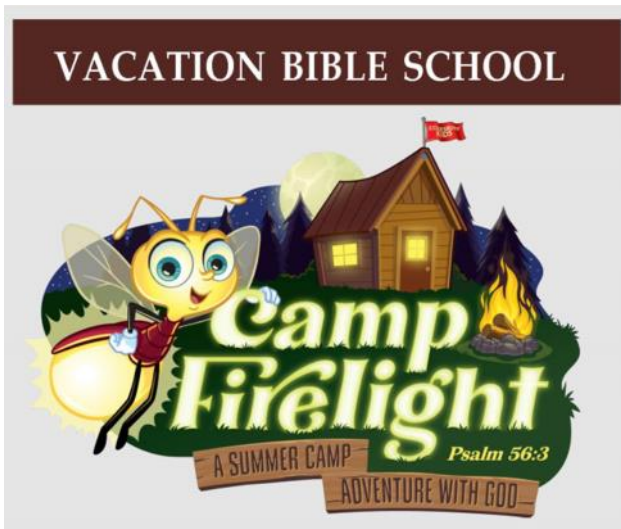
Upcoming Events

What is the Role of Church Ministry in the Church?

- **Stewardship:** Church ministries promote responsible stewardship of resources, encouraging the congregation to use their time, talents, and finances for the greater good and the advancement of the church's mission.
- **Pastoral Care:** Church ministries are involved in caring for the emotional and spiritual well-being of the members. Pastoral care encompasses providing comfort during times of crisis, visiting the sick or bereaved, and offering a compassionate presence to those in need.
- **Unity and Fellowship:** Church ministries foster a sense of community and unity among the congregation members. Church ministries organize social events, fellowship gatherings, and small groups to build relationships and create a supportive network within the church.
- **Discipleship and Education:** Ministries are responsible for facilitating discipleship programs, Bible studies, and educational opportunities that encourage personal growth and maturity in the Christian faith. These initiatives aim to equip individuals with the knowledge and tools to live out their beliefs in practical ways.
- **Spiritual Nurturing:** Church ministry is responsible for providing spiritual guidance, teaching, and support to the congregation. The responsibilities include Bible studies, prayer meetings, and other activities that help individuals deepen their faith and understanding of their religious beliefs.
- **Mission and Evangelism:** Church ministries often participate in spreading the gospel and evangelizing to bring new individuals into the faith.
- **Worship and Celebration:** Ministries are instrumental in organizing and providing support by serving in one or sometimes more of the ministries within our church (Such as those listed below). Church ministries ensure that the congregation has meaningful and inspiring opportunities to come together in worship, prayer, and praise.
- **Leadership Development:** Ministries play a role in identifying and nurturing potential leaders within the church community.
- **Youth and Next-Generation Involvement:** Ministries for youth and children are important for raising the next generation's faith. Churches are sure to keep going and grow in the future by putting time and money into the spiritual growth of young people.

To the Faithful of the Diocese of Prince Albert,

This letter shares the new appointments for the 2024–2025 year, effective August 6, 2024 unless otherwise indicated.

Deanery 1:

- **Fr. Michael Fahlman** will resume as part-time Pastor of St. Mary in Christopher Lake, St. Joseph in Elkridge/Waskesiu (summer) and full-time as Chancellor, Moderator of the Curia, and Marriage Preparation Coordinator for Prince Albert and area.
- **Fr. Phinh Do** will serve as Associate Pastor of Sacred Heart Cathedral in Prince Albert. Under the direction of the Rector, he will share in the appointed ministry to the parish, schools, and senior home.
- **Fr. Nick Ferreras** will continue to serve as full-time Chaplain of the Victoria Hospital in Prince Albert, Chaplain of Pineview Terrace with Mass and will be available for Sunday replacement ministry.
- **Fr. Jim Kaptein** will serve as Spiritual Coordinator to the Filipino community in Prince Albert and area. He will continue to serve as Pastor of St. Joseph Parish in Prince Albert, Chaplain of Holy Cross, St. Francis, and St. Catherine schools, and celebrate Mass every Saturday at Points West Living. He will also continue to serve as Diocesan Representative to the Mont St. Joseph Care Home Board in Prince Albert, Moderator to the Bishop's Senate and Dean of Deanery 1.
- **Fr. Peter Nnanga, MSP** will serve as Pastor of St. Mark in Prince Albert, St. James in Albertville, and Mission of St. James in Candle Lake. He will celebrate Sunday Mass once a month at River Breeze Retirement Complex, Carment Court, Sherman Towers, and Good Shepherd Care Home, and serve as Chaplain of St. John Community School. He will continue to serve as Spiritual Advisor of the Diocesan Catholic Women's League.
- **Fr. Tuyen Vu** will serve as part-time Chaplain to Rose Garden Hospice and will be available for Sunday replacement ministry. He will continue to assist the Chaplain of the Victoria Hospital in Prince Albert as needed, including days off and vacation time. In particular, he will assist on Wednesdays and Fridays at the Hospital, and twice a month on Wednesdays at Herb Basset Home. Also, he will continue to assist the Chaplain of The Sisters of the Presentation of Mary at the 3101 Infirmary in Prince Albert 3 days a week, including vacation time. In particular, he will assist with Mass on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays.

Deanery 3:

- **Fr. Roger Paponette** will serve as Administrator of Blessed Sacrament in Duck Lake, St. Michael in Beardy's and Okemasis First Nation, St. Odilon in Rosthern, and Our Lady of Lourdes Shrine at St. Laurent.

Deanery 5

- **Fr. Sebastian Kunnath** will serve as Pastor of Christ the King in Edam, St. Hippolyte in Vawn, St. Leon in Jackfish, and Notre Dame de Fatima in Meota.
- **Fr. Tai Le** will serve as Pastor of St. Joseph Calasanctius in North Battleford, Chaplain of Holy Family School and École Monseigneur Blaise Morand, and minister to River Heights Lodge. He will continue to serve as the Master of Ceremonies for the Diocese.
- **Fr. Manh Nguyen** will serve as Pastor of St. Vital in Battleford and St. Jean Baptiste de la Salle in Delmas. He will also serve as Chaplain of St. Germaine in Red Pheasant First Nation, St. Bernadette in Mosquito Grizzly Bear's Head Lean Man First Nation, St. Vital Catholic School and the Battlefords District Care Centre.
- **Fr. Edward Obi, MSP** will serve as Administrator of St. Rose de Lima in Cochin, Holy Cross in Glaslyn, and St. Charles Borromeo in Moosomin First Nation.
- **Fr. Barry Tkachuk** will serve as Pastor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Cut Knife, St. Charles in Marsden, St. Thomas in Sweetgrass First Nation and Ste. Angele in Poundmaker First Nation.
- **Fr. Millan Sajonas** will serve as Associate State Chaplain to Saskatchewan Knights of Columbus State Council.
